

[Indian Boundary]

Sunday 9th July 1797 began a Survey of the line according to treaty by Genl. Wayne of Augt 3^d 1795 at the upper place of the Tuscarawas branch of the Muskingum river above Fort Lawrence at a bottom Oak tree 10 inches in diameter standing on the flat bank of said fork or river, which tree is notched with three notches on the North and west sides, with this inscription — Surveyed according to treaty by Genl. Wayne a line to Loraines S $78^{\circ}50'W$

From which tree a Hackberry 3 inches in diameter, and a Cherry 14 inches in diameter bears South $51^{\circ}30'W$ the Hackberry 25 lbs and Cherry 6 lbs distant — and a white Walnut 8 inches diameter bears South $45^{\circ}W$ 45 links distant — and a Sycamore on the East side of the river 8 inches in diameter bears South $51^{\circ}E$ the white Walnut with three notches and blazed above — There
