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Went to Bird's corner and equalized, set his corner and
blazed the line across the end of Bird's north to the corner
where I commenced.

Question, Did you try the field notes and compare them with
the trees? When I study about it I think that one of the
trees did not exactly compare with its course and bearing by
my compass then which satisfies me more than ever, that the
first surveyor made the transposition above referred to.

In running the line yesterday, I commenced at the quarter
post on the north side of Section Seven, and followed and
followed a true blazed line, which I suppose to be the line
run for Mr. Bird for two reasons, one, that Mr.
Spurgin showed me where we commenced before near
on the south of Bird's land and second because I came
out so near where I am of opinion I found the corner
in dispute, when I first made the survey.
