A Survey made for Thomas Allison and J. J. Finney on July 18th 1890, to establish the corner between lots 2nd & 3, in the 2^d gr. in Tp 9, of Range 8.

Legal notice was served on A. D. McMillen and Isaac Underhill 20 days prior to the above date, that a survey would be made on the above date for the purpose named above.

I had surveyed the line between those two lots, over 10 years ago, and also on the 14th day of May 1890. Each Survey showing the same line.

On July 18th 1890, I examined witnesses as follows:

Nancy Craig, formerly Nancy Allison, being first duly sworn says: At the place we now are at, being the corner between lots 2nd & 3 East, 2^d gr. Tp 9, R 8, 10 years ago I saw a red oak or black oak tree which my father pointed out as the witness tree for the corner of the lots named, and I point out the place as about where the stake now stands is, as the place it stood. The road went on each side of the tree spoken of by me.

At the west corner of lots 2nd & 3, I have in former years seen a gum tree, said to be the corner of said lots. It was just on the bank at the north side of the road, about where I now stand, and at, or near the stake now in the ground. I am able to locate the tree by the line coming from the north, and a lane formerly on the south, and a Cooper Shop in the corner of lot 3 (sw).

Samuel Kers being first duly sworn says: At the place we now are at, being at the corner of lots 2nd & 3 East, 2^d gr. Tp 9, R 8, I have recollection of a black oak tree, some 15 or 16 inches in diameter standing at a point where the road coming from the west, and at its intersection with the north and south road located on the gr. Tp line, and that the tree was just west of the north and south road, and the road coming from the west went; or there was a drive on both north and south side of the tree. Can't say whether it was a witness
