You are hereby notified that a survey will be made and testimony taken by the County Surveyor of Holmes County, Ohio, on the 19th day of July, 1894, between the hours of 10 A.M., and 6 P.M., and to continue from time to time at the request of said County Surveyor until the lines, boundaries and corners of the following described tract of land, now owned and held by John McKelvey and situate in Killbuck township, Holmes County, Ohio, can be established:

Being the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 23, Twp. 8, R. 8.

Interested parties are hereby notified to give said Surveyor the names of witnesses they wish subpoenaed, and to be present at said Survey.

On the 19th day of July, 1894, the day appointed for the Survey I proceeded to the grounds for the purposes set forth in the notice. For the reason that it was inconvenient to the parties interested to be present, as the neighbors were threshing, we postponed the survey till August 14, 1894.

On August 14, I again proceeded with the survey selecting as chainmen J. Brink and L. Smith; as marker Ed. Genet. By request of McKelvey, the survey was again postponed till August 28, 1894.

On August 28, we began the survey from a stone at the Northwest corner of the Northwest Quarter of Section 23 Twp 8 R8; thence running south $4^{\circ}35'W$ $79\frac{1}{2}$ links to a stone at half quarter corner on west line thence $84^{\circ}35'W$ $79\frac{1}{2}$ links to the quarter corner;

Established a stone corner and took the following as a witness to the same: white ash 6 $840^{\circ}E$ 3 links, thence $84^{\circ}35'W$ along the west line of the Southwest Quarter, of said section $79\frac{1}{2}$ links to a stone at the west half quarter post.
