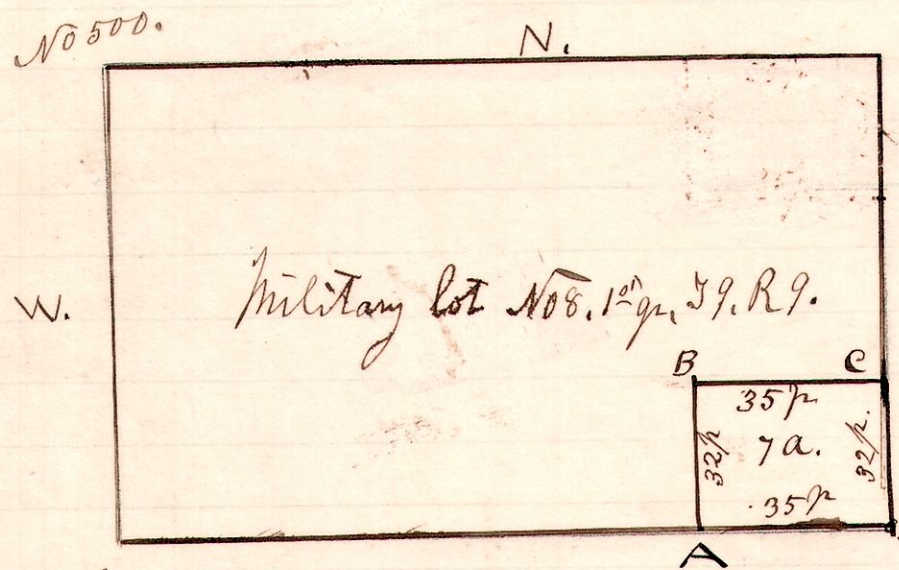

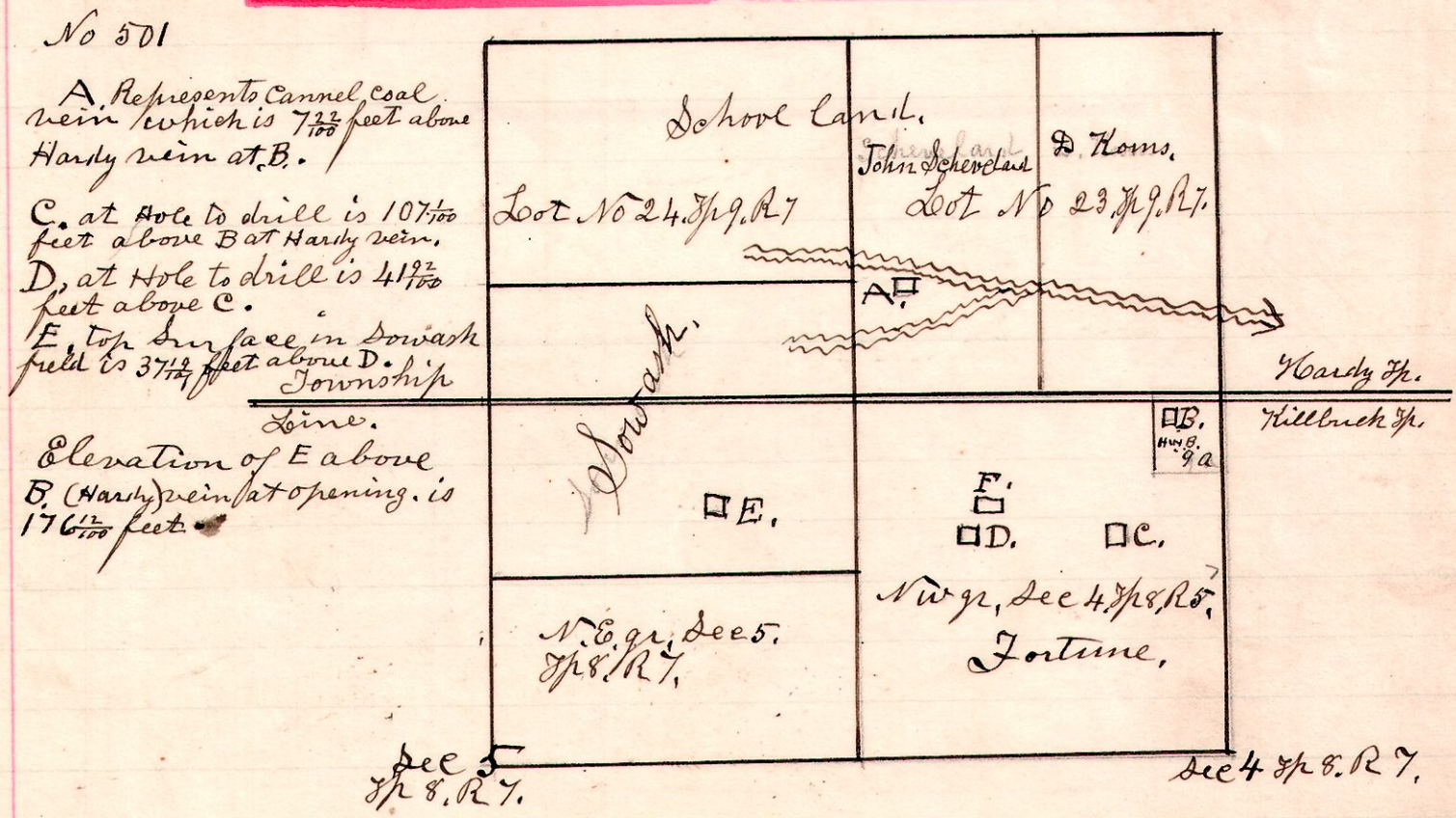

 Elevation of E above B (Hardy vein) at opening is 176 1/2 feet.
