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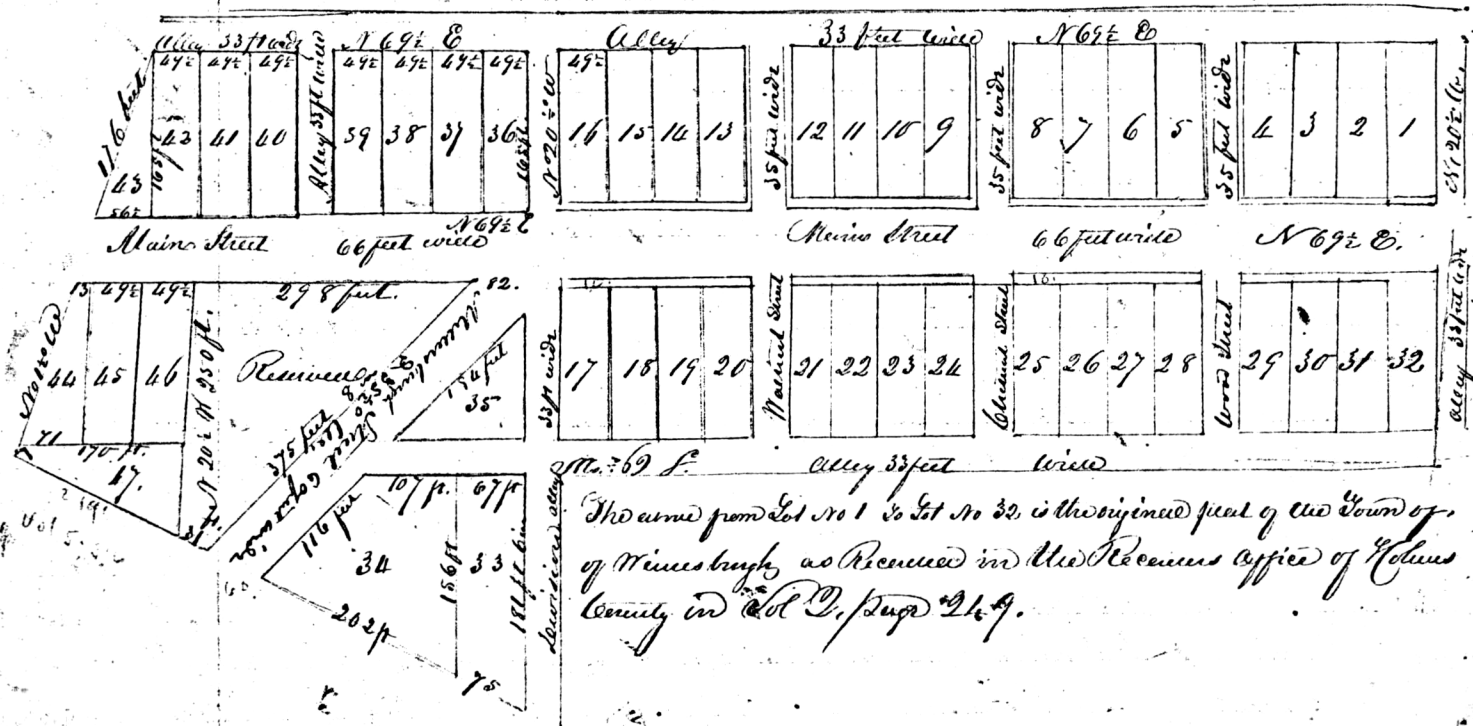

 quantity of Lewis hereby granted to the said Dennis Schwenk entrusted and  
 his heirs and assigns shall remain and defend by their presents -

 and the said Elizabeth being of free age and by me Examined, according to Law, and  
 the contents being first made known to her she acknowledged that she executed the  
 said deed freely without fear or coercion from her said husband since and after my hand
