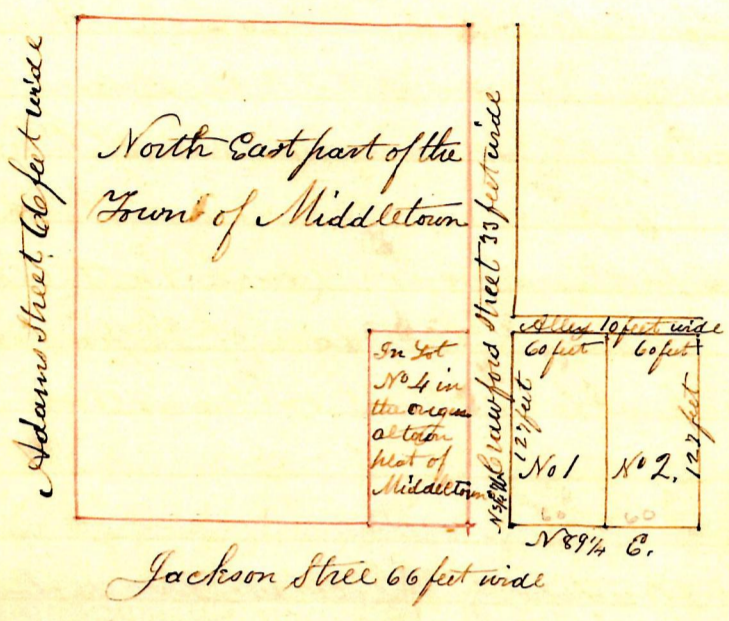


Addition to Middletown

Know all men by these presents that we John Shank and Julian Shank his wife of the county of Holmes and State of Ohio in consideration of the sum of six hundred

Dollars to us in hand paid by Alexander Berington of said County do remise release and forever quit claim unto the said Alexander Berington his heirs and assigns forever, all our title interest and Estate legal and equitable in the following pieces with the appurtenances Situate in Holmes County described as follows, to wit: beginning at the N. E. corner of the N. E. qr of Section seventeen in Township nine Range nine, thence one hundred rods, thence North Eighty rods, thence East one hundred rods thence Eighty rods to the place of beginning containing fifty acres
