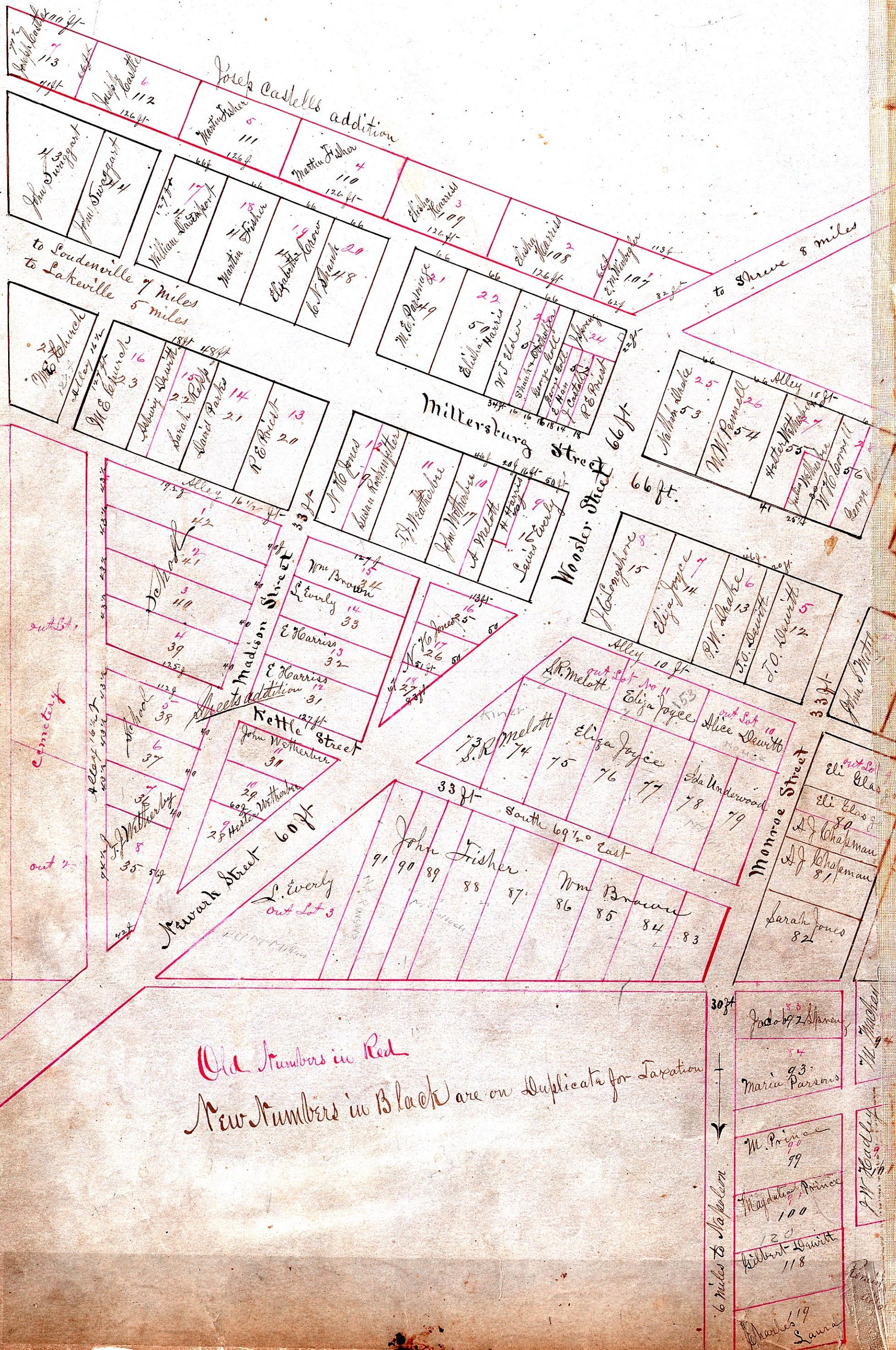

D. 1881 for the purpose of incorporating said Village

McCallhorn Surveyor - The report of the viewers in relation to the establishment of said road, having been this day publicly read being the third reading of the same and no objections being made, nor damages claimed, nor petition for Review filed, and the Board being of opinion that said road, as laid out and surveyed, will be of public utility, it is ordered that the reports of said viewers, with the survey and plat of said road, be recorded, and that said road be established a public highway thirty feet in width. It is further ordered, that the County Auditor issue an order, in the name of the Board, directing the trustees of German Township to cause said road to be opened, according to law

Commissioners met for the purpose of examining the petition which has been on file in the auditor's office for more than five weeks as the law requires and signed by more than thirty electors of the village of Washville for the purpose of incorporating said village. The Commissioners found no remonstrance nor complaints made but upon such hearing found that the petition contains all the matters required that its statements are true that the names proposed is appropriate that the limits of the proposed corporation are accurately described and are not unreasonably large or small that the maps or plats is accurate that the persons whose names are subscribed to the petition are electors residing on the territory that notice has been given as required by law that there is the required population for the proposed corporation and the Commissioners found all papers in regular order and that the prayer of the petition be granted and an order to be entered on these journals to the effect that the Corporation may be organized
